One-on-One: Read the Fluency Assessment Passage to the student so she or he can hear fluent reading. Have the student read the passage. If the student gets stuck on a word, read the word and have her or him repeat it. Repeated one-on-one readings will increase smoothness and expression. Timed Total Reading: Have a student start a stopwatch as she or he begins the passage, and stop it at the end. The student can record the reading time on a chart. Reading time will drop as the student repeats ...

Fluency Passages Grade 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 | Reading Fluency Assessments Reading fluency passages, fluency drills, and or reading fluency assessments are a quick method of assessing a child's basic reading level and fluency by examining both accuracy and the types of miscues, omissions, substitutions or tracking errors.

By fourth grade your child should be reading a minimum of 93 w.p.m. (words per minute) at the beginning of the year. Students progress to a reading rate of 105 w.p.m. (words per minute) by mid-year. As the fourth grade year comes to a close, your child should be reading at least 118 w.p.m (words per minute).
