If a worker is injured or becomes ill at work, the employer will often have to record the incident as a "work-related injury or illness" on OSHA's Form 301, Injury and Illness Report, and OSHA's Form 300, Log of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses.. In this article, we'll explain to you exactly what a recordable injury or illness is and which establishments have to do the recording.

What is an OSHA Recordable Work-Related Injury or Illness?

Injuries and illnesses that occur while an employee is working at home, including work in a home office, will be considered work-related if the injury or illness occurs while the employee is performing work for pay or compensation in the home, and the injury or illness is directly related to the performance of work rather than to the general home environment or setting.

"Work-related diseases" have multiple causes, where factors in the work environment may play a role, together with other risk factors, in the development of such diseases. OSHA published a Final Rule to amend its recordkeeping regulation to remove the requirement to electronically submit to OSHA information from the OSHA Form 300 (Log of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses) and OSHA Form 301 (Injury and Illness Incident Report) for establishments with 250 or more employees that are required to routinely keep injury and illness records.

A work related injury is an injury or illness caused, contributed or significantly aggravated by events or exposures in the work environment. Work related injuries occur on the job and as a direct result of the tasks allotted to the specific job.

Work-related injuries, illnesses and deaths impose costs on employers, workers and the community. These include both direct costs and indirect costs: Direct costs include items such as workers' compensation premiums paid by employers or payments to injured or incapacitated workers from workers' compensation jurisdictions.

The traumatic injuries of the muscles, tendons and nerves due to accidents are not considered to be WMSDs or are considered separately. However, there are organizations, such as the European Agency for Safety and Health at Work, that include acute traumas and fractures within in the WMSD group.

All medical care related to the injury or illness will be covered by workers' compensation or provided by healthcare providers authorized by the New York State Workers' Compensation Board. Surviving spouses and minor children of workers who are killed in work accidents or succumb to occupational diseases may be entitled to benefits as well, for lost earnings and funeral costs.

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
